

SAFETY AT THE RANCH

- 1. Helmets** must be worn by ALL participants on horses and the ropes course.
- 2. Lifejackets** must be worn by ALL participants during boating regardless of swimming level attained.
Any camper unable to pass a swimming test must wear a lifejacket at all times while in the water.
- 3. Counselors** are trained in all program areas and are required to have Standard First Aid and CPR certification as a condition of their employment.

There are no exceptions to any of these policies

Behavioral Guidelines

In order to remain a fun and safe place for all, the Ranch has the following behavioral guidelines in place.

- **Respect** is a two-way street at OLQP. It is expected that both the counselor and the campers treat each other with respect. Some examples of disrespect include, but are not limited to: verbal abuse, yelling, physical violence and hazing.
- **Cooperation:** The counselors work hard to plan a week of fun and activities. We expect that the children will participate in all activities **UNLESS** the activity has been identified by the parent as an activity the camper is not permitted to participate in.
- **Bullying** is not acceptable at the Ranch. We do our best to use all situations as a chance for growth, however, if a child's bullying behavior is persistent they will be sent home.
- **Violence** of any kind is not tolerated.
- **Drug, Tobacco, Alcohol or Weapons of any kind are not tolerated.** Campers will be sent home immediately if caught in possession of any of these items. For those items that are illegal, charges will be laid at the discretion of the Ranch.
- **Vandalism or Stealing:** Campers will be sent home immediately if caught being involved in either of these acts, and charged at the discretion of the Ranch. As well, the parents or guardians will be responsible for any costs incurred for the damages.
